

CAMPER BEHAVIOR

Camp rules are reviewed by counselors in each cabin and by the director in camp orientation. It is agreed by your paid registration that your camper will obey the camp leadership and follow the behavior guidelines. The "Standards of Conduct" provide a framework for how persons and property are to be treated. These are available on request and on our website.

There is zero-tolerance for illegal drugs, violent or abusive behavior.

Campers may be expelled for reason of misconduct with absolutely no refund. Possession of controlled substances & acts of violence are also reportable as crimes.

CAMPER FEES AND OTHER COSTS

Tuition for all camps is \$275 per week

Campers are not registered without a deposit of \$75 [a non-refundable registration fee].

The \$75 non-refundable registration fee is included in the \$275 weekly tuition.

Full payment (balance) should be made at least two weeks before the date the camper is to arrive at camp. This makes registration day go much faster.

PREMIUM ACTIVITIES

Tubing – add \$40 per week.

FREE T-SHIRT

Campers registered and paid in full within 14 days of camp will get a free shirt.

DISCOUNTS

SIBLING DISCOUNT

The sibling discount is \$15.00 and applies to each camper in your household. This discount is applied after at least two campers are registered (a deposit is required).

GROUP DISCOUNT

This has been extended to churches and groups that send at least ten campers to Camp Horizon. The group must arrange with the registrar in advance for this discount.

CAMPER ASSISTANCE

If you are not eligible for other discounts or are unable to afford the full tuition you can apply for Camper Assistance (certain rules apply). This is one of the online forms. This form is not visible on the camper dashboard until the camper is enrolled.

SPENDING MONEY

We ask that your camper not keep any cash in their cabin. We put their money in an account and keep track of purchases on a ledger. We then refund the balance on Saturday. You may put spending money in their accounts when you register and add funds to their accounts at any time.

JUNIOR CAMP

Junior Campers have a total of 5 trips to Snack-Shack.

The limit for Junior Camp snacks is: \$15 (\$3 per day)
This does not include non-food items

TEEN CAMP

These camps each have 10 trips to Snack-Shack.

There is no limit for Teen campers.

Non-food items include T-Shirts, Water Bottles, and any souvenirs or toiletry items available in the store.

REFUNDS

The registration fee (\$75) is not refundable.

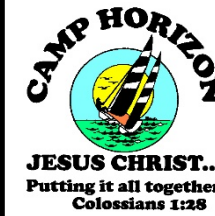
If you cancel at least two weeks before the start of camp you will receive all funds paid except the registration fee portion of your tuition (\$75).

If you cancel 13 days or less we will not refund your tuition. The entire \$275 is the amount owed. Only payments for premium activities and spending money are refunded.

Exception: If your child is ill and you provide documentation from a health-care provider that they were unable to attend camp due to health reasons we will refund all but the registration fee.

BRING A FRIEND CHALLENGE

We encourage you to be a representative of Camp Horizon to your friends and classmates.

The Rules

- 3) The first-time camper needs to verify with us that you invited them. (Send us an email)
- 4) Verification must be complete no later than 2 weeks before the week of camp (tuition balance due date).



SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

Our counselors, cooks, craft instructors, and support staff are volunteers who are recommended by the leaders of their local church.

We have chapel twice each full day of the camp. The speakers are selected to meet the needs of the age group of the campers.

Each cabin has group devotions and prayer time. At the older camps there is time for individual devotions as well.

Bible verse memorization is a part of the competition. The campers are encouraged to memorize at least one verse from God's Word each day.



CHOOSE YOUR OWN ACTIVITIES

Camp Horizon is located on the shoreline of Lake Harris. We have the following water sports available:

- Fishing (current license required if 15 or older)
- Swimming
- Canoeing
- Sailing
- Skiing/Tubing (\$35 - limited enrollment)

A natural forest surrounds us on three sides. Within this area you may enjoy:

- Archery
- Riflery
- Nature Walks

We also have a gymnasium, playing field, backstop, soccer goals, a sand volleyball court, a craft shed, and a swimming pool. [There are lots of places to have fun!](#)

CAMP FRIENDS ARE FOREVER!



Our summer camp volunteers number well over one hundred each year. These include people that transport campers from their area, help with pre-season setup, as well as those that serve during the summer program. [Application must be completed online by April 15.](#)

We average fifty staff members each week of summer camp. These include the Program Director, Speaker, Nurse, Boat Driver, Maintenance Crew, Kitchen Crew, Counselors, and Activity Instructors. You might wonder where we get so many people to serve on summer staff as volunteers (no pay).

Many of our summer staff volunteers were once campers. Others are parents of staff members and veteran campers. Some have served on staff for decades. Friendships made at camp tend to last a lifetime (and beyond for those of us that have put our faith in Jesus Christ).

PREMIUM CAMP ACTIVITIES

Only one activity is offered that has an additional cost. This is water-skiing / tubing (\$40.00 per week).

STAFF BACKGROUND SCREENING

All staff members are screened locally and must have a testimony of faith in Jesus Christ. They must regularly attend an evangelical fellowship and have recommendations from there. A local criminal background screen is performed and fingerprinting is now mandatory for summer staff volunteers. (dcfbackgroundscreening.com)

CABIN ASSIGNMENTS

HOW ARE CABINS ASSIGNED?

We allow each camper to select **ONE** other camper of the same age (a "buddy"). If multiple buddies are listed - only the first will be honored.

Please do not ask us to keep groups of friends together. Pair them up in groups of two. This will allow them to make new friends. This is what camp is about. Campers choose four activities - so they can still be together during the day with friends in other cabins. Friends who prove to be a discipline problem together will be separated.

Our program utilizes teams consisting of one cabin of boys and one cabin of girls. It is important to assign campers according to age to keep the teams equal. The oldest cabin and youngest cabins tend to be of the same age and the two middle cabins are mixed proportionately.

Requesting friends or siblings be put together that are not the same age will usually result in the older one being placed in a younger cabin. This may create a poor social situation and could result in their separation if a problem arises.

CAMPER MAIL

Mail Call is Monday-Friday (lunch). You may consider sending your first letter on the Thursday before camp so they will have a letter on Monday. They sing (with a group) for 3 USPS letters or 1 package. Emails do not count for singing. **Hint:** Packages may be left in the office on Registration Day for delivery on a specific day of the week (a good trick to save postage).

Candy is not allowed in the cabins. Snacks sent by mail can only be stored in the cabin if unopened.

CAMPER MESSAGING (UPDATED FOR 2018)

The camper message program for 2018 has been released. Parents are able to send one-way emails to their campers from the Camper Dashboard directly or by using a code on a by-invite only website. The parent can send invitations to family members (and even themselves) which will contain a link to the email program directly and an access code. The code is linked to the camper - not the week.

We do not print office email or faxed letters to campers. Campers do not have email access to write back. This is a ONE-WAY message service.



WHAT SHOULD I PACK TO BRING TO CAMP?

Be sure to pack enough clothing for seven days and six nights. You may be in and out of the pool - lake - gym - playing field - showers. It is suggested that you bring an extra swimsuit - extra towels (2-4) and extra socks and underwear.

CHECKLIST

- Pillow
- Sleeping bag **or** long twin sheets and a light blanket. **Cabins are air-conditioned.**
- Towels - at least 2
- Sports and play clothes for 6 active days.
- No short shorts or short shirts**
The belly must be covered
- Shorts must be below your fingertips (standing straight) for both boys and girls.**
- No strapless tank-tops or halter tops
- Tank-Top / Tee-Shirt straps must be 2" wide
- Shirts with sleeves are required in the Dining Hall and Chapel
- Swimsuits – Two (2) one-piece modest suits
Girls: 2-piece suits are not allowed unless covered with a dark shirt
Guys: Fingertip length required
- Dress outfit for Friday Night Banquet (optional) Check our website for the weekly theme.
- Shoes - Sneakers (an old pair works great for exploring, etc), sandals or water socks, and dress shoes (optional). [Do not buy new shoes for camp.](#)
- Insect repellent – Sunscreen – Hat (one you will wear).
- Flashlight – Rain gear (optional)
- Bible and notebook
- Pen, notepaper and stamps
- Toothpaste, toothbrush, shampoo, soap, deodorant etc.
- All money should be deposited in your account for Snak Shak. Valuables are kept in the safe.

MARK ALL ITEMS WITH YOUR NAME

WHAT NOT TO BRING TO CAMP?

- No Radios. No Audio/Video Players of any kind.
- **No Electronic Devices** (Includes Tablets, Nooks, Kindles, or other internet devices)
- **No Cell Phones**
 - **Stored & used in the office only (if brought).**
- No Weapons or Explosives such as Firearms, Knives, Slingshots, Fireworks, or Lighters
- No tobacco products • No alcoholic beverages • No intoxicants of any kind
- No drugs are allowed (Therapeutic medications must be checked in with the camp nurse).
- No pets • No comics • No skateboards
